Breed Rep Report

Whilst the number of members keeping registered Duroc pigs has remained fairly similar year on year, there are still very low number of dedicated breeders when compared to other breeds. Boar lines have held up overall and have also increased slightly in some cases. Lines such as Next Level and Clyde remain low, but these are now both held by at least 2 members thereby giving optimism for the potential to increase the distribution going forwards. Jerry is at risk with no live registered boars remaining in the herd book, but potential young stock may be a route forwards, it very much a case of “watch this space” with regards to Jerry. The number of sows has decreased significantly, but this reflects the retirement of a large herd who only held one bloodline. Overall the numbers in the pedigree registered herd book also reflects the use of the duroc boar as a crossing line and sales of bloodlines outside the pedigree herdbook should not be underestimated, this is a key use of the duroc breed within the UK pig population.
